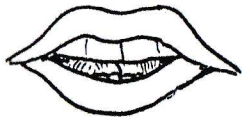


LIP READING THE CONSONANTS - high pitched sounds, not too easy to hear for some.



'v' and 'f'

'v' and 'f' as in versatile and flip
Not hard these. Top teeth touch bottom lip.



'th' and 'the'

'm', 'b' and 'p' as in mouth's basic pose
Not too difficult. The lips simply close.



'm', 'b', and 'p'

'th' and 'the' as in pathway and without
Look between the teeth; the tongue peeps out.



'sh', 'zh', 'j' and 'ch'

'wh', 'qu' and 'w' as in why, quick and Swiss
Lips are puckered here. Bit like in a kiss.



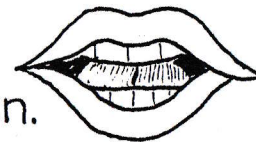
'wh', 'qu' and 'w'

'sh', 'zh', 'j', 'ch' in shut, measure, just, chide
Lips go forward and a bit in at the side.



'x', 'z' and 's'

'l' as in lamp which is lovely and clean
Tongue behind top teeth; its base can be seen.



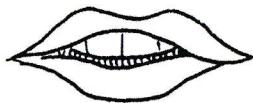
'l'

'x', 'z' and 's' in expect, fizz and sips
Teeth almost close with parted and straight lips.

'n', 't' and 'd' as in nothing, to and drop
Tongue pressed on gums, behind teeth at the top.



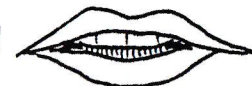
'n', 't', and 'd'

'r' as in mirror and right and reflect
Tongue behind top teeth. Varying effect.

'k', 'g', 'ng', 'h' kicking goals and heading them
Think here of the context, because you must
start guessing 'em!
